



Do you hear that? The roar of the engines, Harley, Yamaha, Honda, yeah that's right we're back for our 2nd annual Military Police Motorcycle Relay Ride!

On 17 August 2010, we will be kicking off this fundraiser to ride again. In a joint effort between Military Police and you, the public, we are going to ride across Canada, this time from Comox, British Columbia to St-John's, Newfoundland. The ride this year is in support of the Military Police Fund for Blind Children and Wounded Warrior. Corporal Stone (the Military Police Bear) will ride along again this year.

The relay will be coordinated in stages, by 16 August 2010, all those starting the ride will meet in Comox, British Columbia. The opening ceremony will take place on the morning of the 17th of August 2010, and proceed across the country to St. John's, Newfoundland, where the ride will end on 10 September 2010, having ridden through all Provinces (known as legs). The legs will start and end near the Provincial border crossing, where the incoming riders will meet the outgoing riders and where the MP Bear will be passed along. This will take place a total of seven times over the three and a half weeks, ending on 10 September 2010, in St. John's, Newfoundland. Throughout the ride, BBQs, lunches, dinners and mini fundraisers will take place, where the riders will meet with local officials and the media. The grand finale will be in CFB Trenton in the form of a Formal Dining In, this is where the two charities will be presented their cheques from the Canadian Forces Provost Marshal, all riders, Sponsors, volunteers and who ever else would like to attend please let us know through the Info@mpnmrr on the official webpage, or call your local Rep.

As an added twist this year, The MP Bear (Cpl Stone) will be going to Kandahar, Afghanistan to visit with the Canadian Forces Personnel to help raise awareness and start the fundraising with a bang. We are hoping that this will create enthusiasm that will carry on into Canada when the bear will be sent to Comox, BC, to kick the ride off and be driven across this great country of ours.
